Introducing IPA to Fraud Insurance Investigators: Participation at the IASIU Europe Seminar in Rome



I recently had the opportunity to attend the 12th IASIU Europe Insurance Fraud Seminar & Expo in Rome, held from June 8–10, 2026 at the A. Roma Lifestyle Hotel. The event brought together more than 250 professionals from across Europe and beyond who are dedicated to fighting insurance fraud.

What is IASIU?

The International Association of Special Investigation Units (IASIU) is the largest organization for insurance investigators worldwide. Founded in 1984 in the USA by a group of insurance fraud investigators, IASIU expanded into Europe in 1990.

The association's primary mission is to educate and raise the skill levels of insurance fraud investigators while ensuring that high ethical standards are maintained. IASIU is a non-profit organization dedicated to:

- Promoting coordinated efforts within the industry to combat insurance fraud
- Providing education and training for insurance investigators
- Developing greater awareness of the insurance fraud problem
- Encouraging high professional standards of conduct among investigators
- Supporting legislation that acts as a deterrent to insurance fraud

The annual IASIU Europe Seminar is a key event in the insurance investigation community, offering a platform to exchange strategies, share technical insights, and build networks necessary to stay ahead of increasingly sophisticated fraudsters.

Until now, all cooperation and project work had been carried out exclusively online, making this first in-person meeting an important milestone for the further development of the project team and its international cooperation.

The meeting was attended by Diego Trolese, Chairperson of the Professional Commission, Philipp Kurz (Germany), Teamleader of the Project Young Members and President of IPA Germany, as well as the project members Mirco Ciccarese (Italy), Vesna Znidaric (Croatia), Yvonne McGregor (United Kingdom) and Joyce O'Grady, Secretary General of IPA Ireland.

During the productive working sessions, the participants focused on the current planning status of YPOS and SYMC, future hosting locations, the strategic orientation of both

formats, as well as necessary amendments to the related procedures and organisational frameworks.

Further discussions addressed future projects such as ILDEP, the promotion and involvement of young members within the IPA, the strategic revision of existing procedures and preparations for the upcoming IPA World Congress.

In addition to the intensive project work, the meeting also provided an excellent opportunity to strengthen personal exchange and international friendship within the team. The participants experienced outstanding hospitality and an excellent conference venue in Turin.

A special highlight of the weekend was the evening visit to the historic Castello Reale di Moncalieri on the outskirts of Turin. Since the post-war period, parts of the castle have been used as the headquarters of the 1st Carabinieri Regiment "Piemonte", while other areas remain open to the public as a museum.

The meeting demonstrated the strong motivation and commitment of the Project Young Members team to further develop international cooperation, professional exchange and sustainable young member involvement within the IPA worldwide.

4th SHEisIPA Seminar at IBZ Schloss Gimborn



Empowering Female Leaders in the IPA and Beyond' 12-17 April 2026



Attending the #SHEisIPA seminar 'Empowering Female Leaders – in the IPA and Beyond' at IBZ Gimborn Germany this April provided the opportunity to meet with women from around the world and discuss their challenges and accomplishments. There were 35 participants from 20 different countries. There were women of various ranks, ages and experience levels. Two male allies attended and they are part of the UN Women Project – HeForShe. International President, Martin Hoffmann joined virtually to welcome the participants and provide an IEB update. It is good to know that there are many men within the IPA who are working hard to change perceptions and make workplaces safer and more inclusive.

I am an officer with the Canada Border Services Agency and Region 9 executive member (Treasurer and Membership). Joining the IPA in 2019 was a life changing decision for me. I had no idea that a worldwide friendship association existed despite being in law enforcement for over two decades at that point. This speaks to the fact that the IPA needs to improve the way it promotes and recruits new members, particularly women. Initiatives such as the #SHEisIPA international project is a fantastic way to showcase the association and all that it offers its members.

Since joining the IPA, I have participated in three international conferences (and was on the organizing committee of the two local ones), one Friendship Week (Scotland 2025) and many social events. In 2023, received the Harvey Creek scholarship (R9) and used it to attend a Professional Development Conference in Germany. It is notable that at each event, I was one of the only women in attendance. When women are part of the IPA, it increases their support network and fosters inclusion in a worldwide community.

During our seminar, there were presentations about female membership and projects. The casual conversations during evening walks or time in the Turmbar helped generate ideas and build strong connections among all the women. I learned that there is a commonality for women in law enforcement that transcends borders. Whether you live in Moldova, the Kingdom of Eswatini, Canada or anywhere in between, you feel an instant connection to colleagues. That feeling was so apparent during our seminar that presenters stated they felt an incomparable energy from the group.

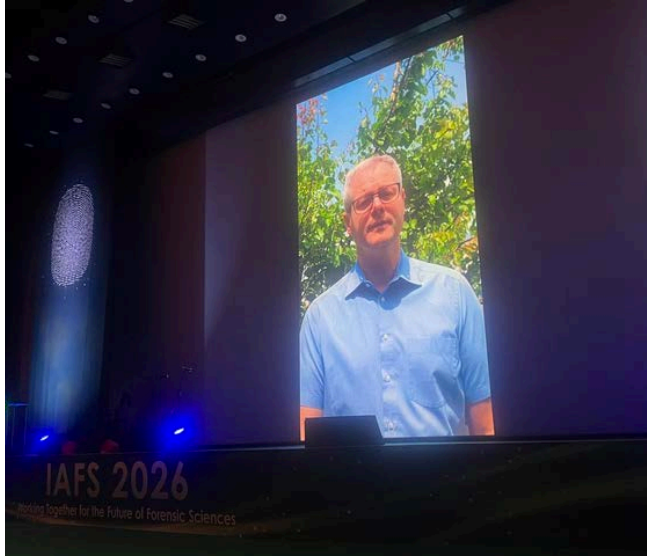

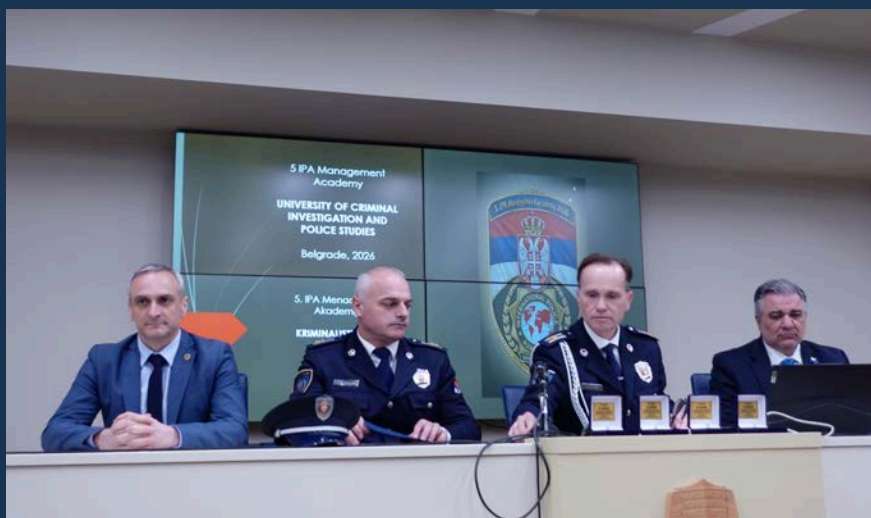

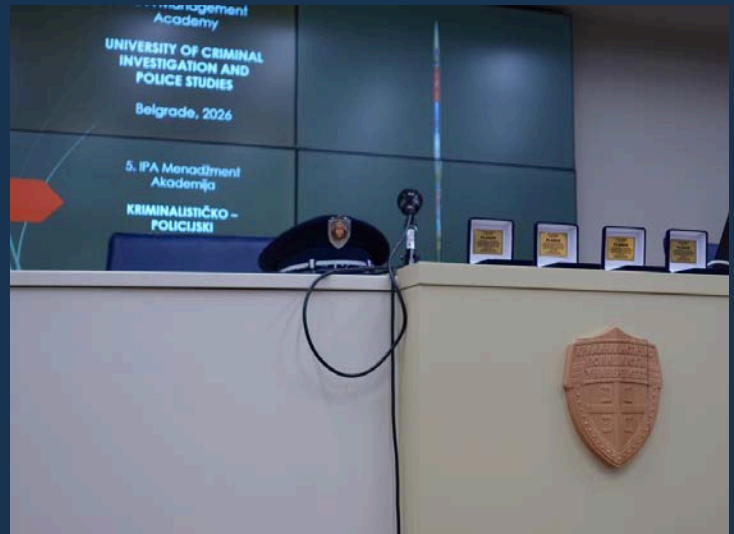

A tour of the Academy of Criminal Investigation and Police Studies and Police Studies was also organized, along with a conversation with students, and at the end a friendship tree was planted in keeping with the motto "Service through Friendship."

All participants received appropriate certificates and medals bearing the IPA Management Academy logo. In addition, three certificates were awarded for the best presentation, best speaker, and best teamwork. On behalf of the President of IPA Serbia, the IPA Management Academy medal was presented to representatives of IPA member states.



This kind of visit by foreign delegations — who expressed support for the Republic of Serbia's candidacy to host the World Congress of the International Police Association, to be held in Belgrade in 2027, at which presidents and senior representatives from 70 member states will participate and bring their families as a token of support for Belgrade as the safest city in Europe — is of enormous significance for the Ministry of Internal Affairs and the Republic of Serbia, both on the international stage and in the policing, political and every other sense.

In 2023, IPA Serbia organized the Mediterranean Conference at the "Palace of Serbia" on the topic "The Migrant Crisis in Europe and the World – Challenges and Solutions," attended by senior police representatives from 33 IPA member states, followed in 2024 by the Balkan-Adriatic Conference at the Chamber of Commerce of Serbia, entitled "United Balkans – Open and Safe," at which 28 high-level delegations from IPA member states participated.

At the close of the gathering, an appropriate cultural and entertainment program was held, at which participants had the opportunity to showcase their talents in an event entitled "IPA Has Got Talent," through song, dance, acting, and other performances, with three trophies awarded on the occasion.

Friendship and Multiculturalism



The basis of the International Police association is friendship between police officers around the world.

The situation is more challenging and complex when it comes to members from different cultures and religions.

The Muslim world celebrates the Feast of Sacrifice at the end of May.

The holiday is celebrated in Israel by Muslims, Druze, Circassians and Bedouins. All have respectable representation in the Israeli Police and the Israel International Police Association.

The Feast of Sacrifice, Eid al-Adha , is intended to commemorate the story of the binding of Isaac by his father Abraham.

The Bible, which Jews, Muslims, and Christians believe in, in fact all believers of the major monotheistic religions, tells of Abraham who was the father of Isaac and Yishmael, the Jews and Muslims. So, if we look at the deeper meaning of the story, it is the story of one family with one father.

The holiday is also celebrated by the Druze, many of whose members serve in the Israel Police and the Prison Service. A third of the members of the IPA Israel presidency are Druze.

The history of the Druze points to the story of Yitro, the priest of Midian, from the Bible. Yitro's daughter, Zipporah, met Moses, who became the leader of the Jews in Egypt.

According to the Bible, Moses married Zipporah and the Druze believe they are descendants of Yitro. Yitro is buried in northern Israel and is a holy site for the Druze. This history creates a long-standing connection between the Druze community and Israel.

In June, the Druze communities in northern Israel celebrated the Feast of Sacrifice. The main event was held by the IPA in Daliyat El Carmel. A beautiful village on the summit of Mount Carmel. There are many holy places in the area for Muslims, Druze, Christians and Jews.

Holy Shrine of the Prophet Abu Ibrahim. For the Jews, this is Elijah, from where faith says he ascended to heaven.

There are also many monasteries in the area: Deir Al-Mukhraqa Carmelite Monastery. Carmel St. Joseph Monastery. Maronite Church.

Friendship and Multiculturalism

This is an excellent example of multiculturalism, of the connection between religions, beliefs, and also joint service in the police and IFA membership.

The President of IPA Israel adv. Gal Sharon and the Secretary General Dr. Eran Israel of IPA represented the association at the event and in her greetings to our Druze friends, she noted:

"The Feast of Sacrifice, Eid al-Adha, is the culmination of the most important holiday for Muslims, Druze, Circassians, and others. One of the most important meanings is the connection to Jewish heritage. The sacrifice in question is the story of the binding of Isaac by Abraham, who ultimately was the father of Isaac and Ishmael. Family closeness has been forgotten over the generations, except for our Druze brothers who have made a brotherly covenant with the Jewish people since the days of Jethro, Moses' father-in-law, the greatest of the prophets, and the leader who united the tribes of Israel into a people".

IPA Slovakia National Congress

On 23–24 May 2026, the National Congress of IPA Slovakia 2026 was held in Banská Bystrica with the participation of the International President of IPA, Martin Hoffmann, as well as delegations from Romania, Hungary, Poland, and the Czech Republic.

The Congress brought several important decisions for the future development of IPA Slovakia. Delegates approved the extension of membership to Military Police officers and abolished the two-year waiting period for joining IPA, making the association more accessible to new and especially younger members.

Policing with Purpose: Living with Multiple Sclerosis

There are moments in life when everything suddenly makes sense. For me, that moment came in 2017, when a consultant at my local NHS hospital confirmed: “You do have MS.” Until then, “M&S” had simply meant a well-known British retailer. From that day forward, it meant Multiple Sclerosis.

The diagnosis finally explained years of unexplained symptoms—fatigue, cognitive fog, dropping objects, and even tripping over nothing. While daunting, it also brought clarity.

Multiple Sclerosis is a neurological condition where the immune system attacks the protective covering of nerves, disrupting communication between the brain and body. Symptoms vary greatly between individuals and, although there is currently no cure, research and treatment continue to progress.

Like many police officers, I approached the diagnosis head-on. After the initial shock, I focused on understanding the condition and identifying practical ways to manage it.

I found valuable support through organisations such as Overcoming MS and the Kent Neuro Therapy Centre, whose evidence-based approaches to lifestyle and wellbeing proved invaluable.

Nearly a decade on from my first symptoms, MS remains part of my life, but it does not define it.

One of the biggest lessons has been learning to adapt. Through experience, I identified dietary triggers affecting my symptoms and made significant lifestyle changes. I have also had to adjust how I work, recognising the importance of managing fatigue and chronic pain.

I joined the Metropolitan Police Service in 2005 and became a detective in 2016. Policing is far more than a profession—it is a commitment to serving others. MS has changed how I perform that role, but not my dedication to it.

While I am unlikely to return to frontline duties, I continue to contribute through investigative and administrative work.



Policing with Purpose: Living with Multiple Sclerosis



The COVID-19 pandemic demonstrated how adaptable policing can be, with remote working providing opportunities for officers with long-term health conditions to remain productive and engaged.

This experience highlights an important reality: there remains a valuable place within policing for officers and staff living with chronic conditions.

Living with MS presents daily challenges. Plans can change unexpectedly, energy levels fluctuate, and even simple tasks may require significant effort. For those used to the demands and discipline of policing, adjusting expectations is not always easy. Yet resilience is deeply embedded within policing culture, and it is that resilience which enables adaptation rather than withdrawal.

During the pandemic, I became lead for the Metropolitan Police MS Support Network, helping officers and staff connect, share experiences and access support. This reinforced the importance of community—something also central to the International Police Association.

With this in mind, I am now working towards establishing an IPA MS Support Network to connect members internationally who are living with MS or supporting loved ones affected by the condition. The aim is to create a network based on shared experience, practical support and understanding. A diagnosis such as MS changes the way you live and work, but it does not diminish your value, purpose or ability to contribute. Policing taught me resilience, adaptability and determination. MS has reinforced those lessons in ways I never expected.

Together, they have shaped a different path—one that still allows me to serve, support others and remain part of the policing family.

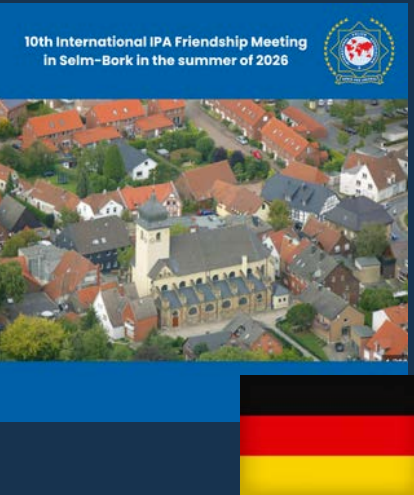

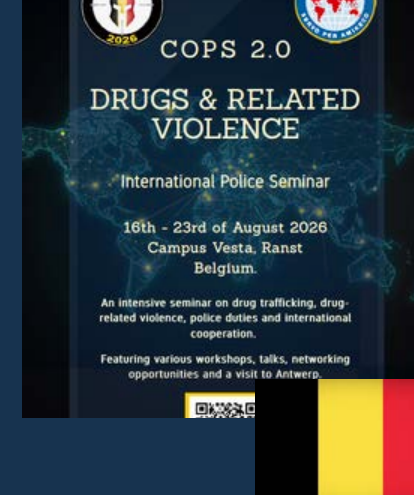

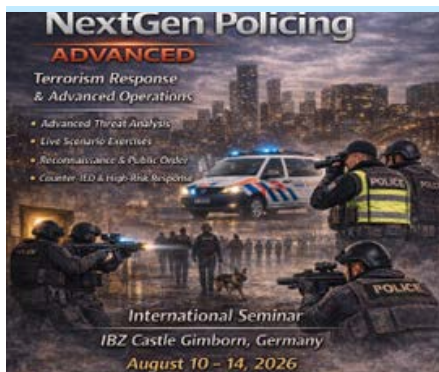
